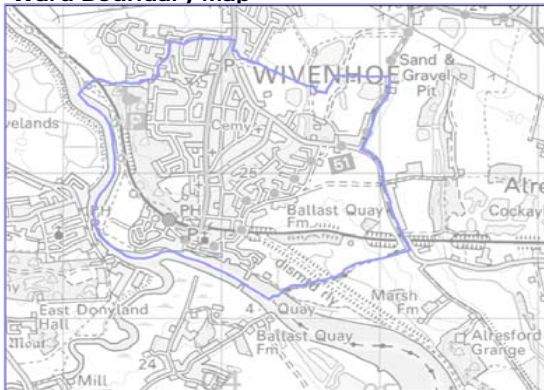
Wivenhoe Quay

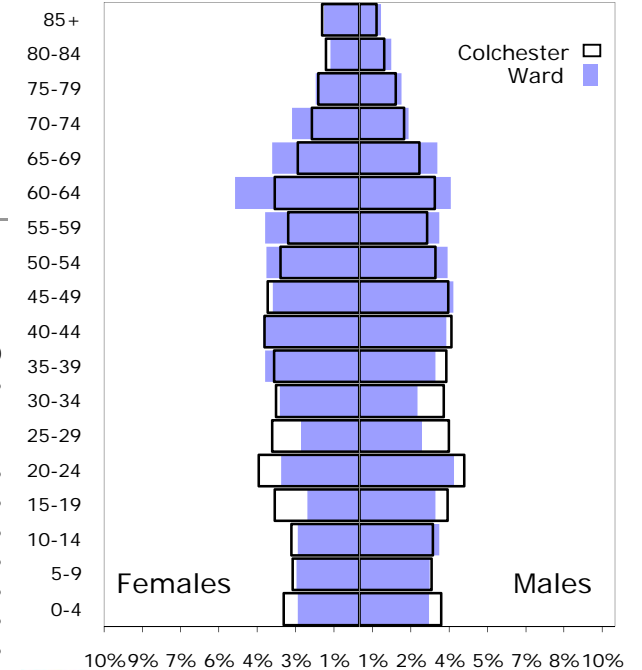

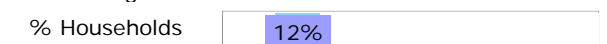

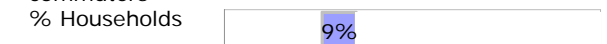

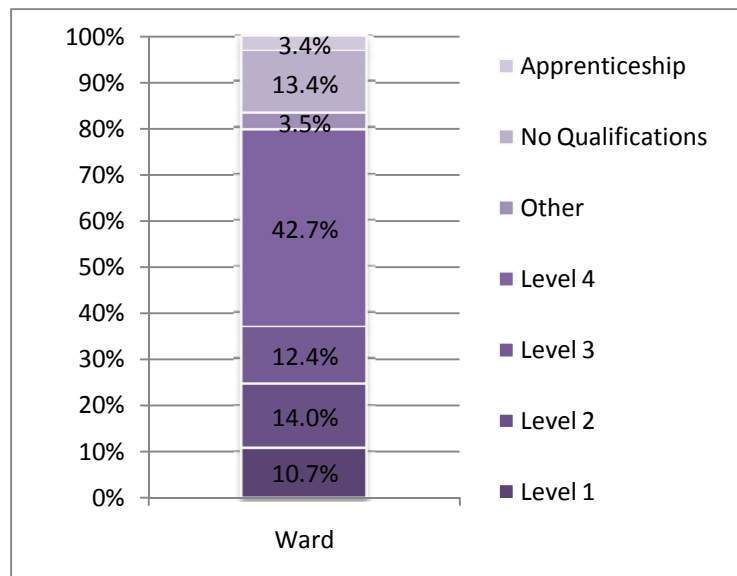

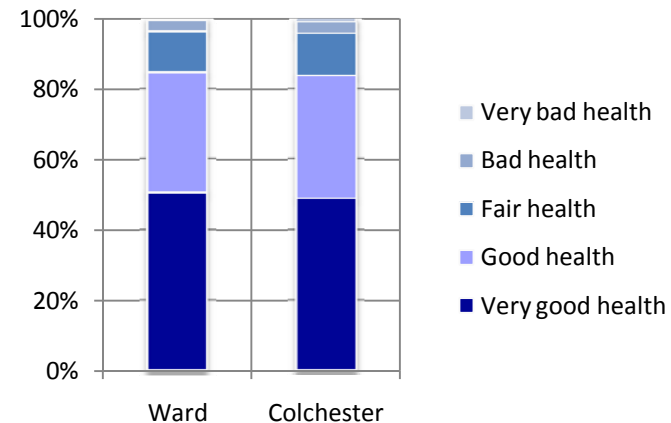

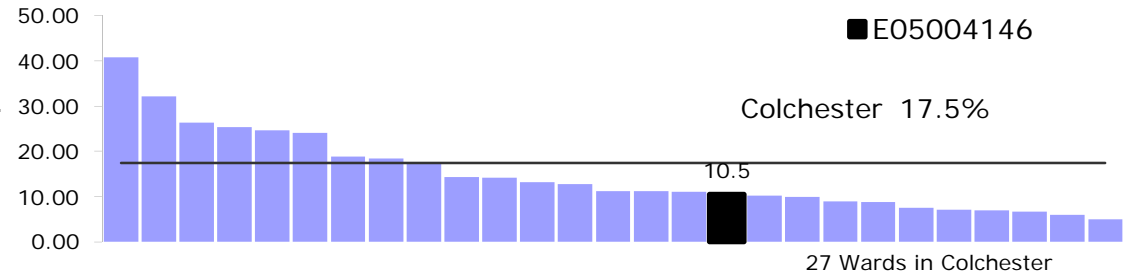
# Child Poverty

# Fuel Poverty

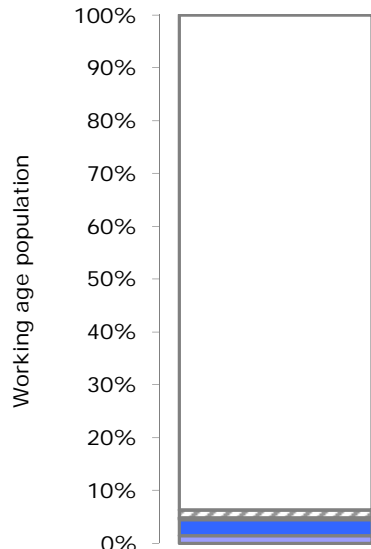
A household is said to be in fuel poverty if it needs to spend more than 10% income on fuel to maintain an adequate level of warmth.
