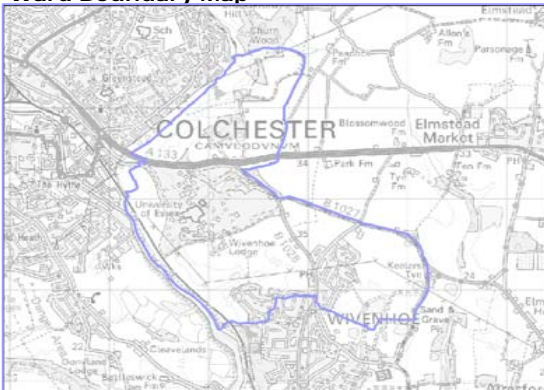
Wivenhoe Cross

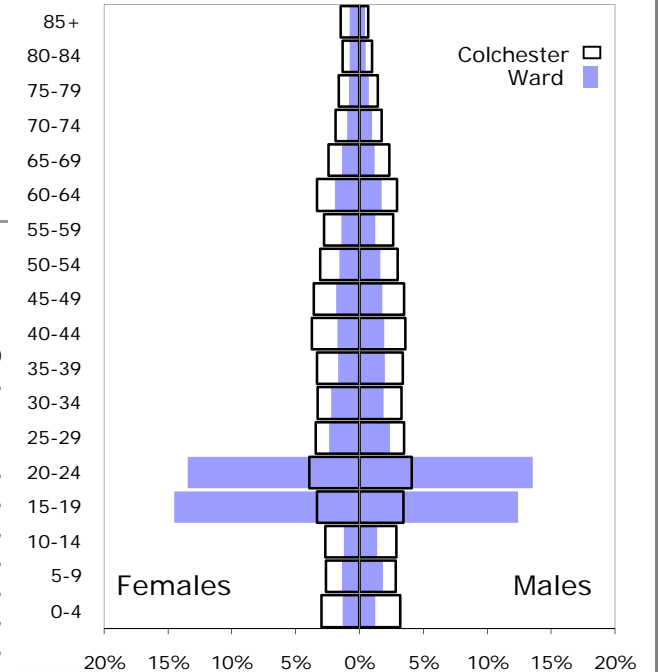

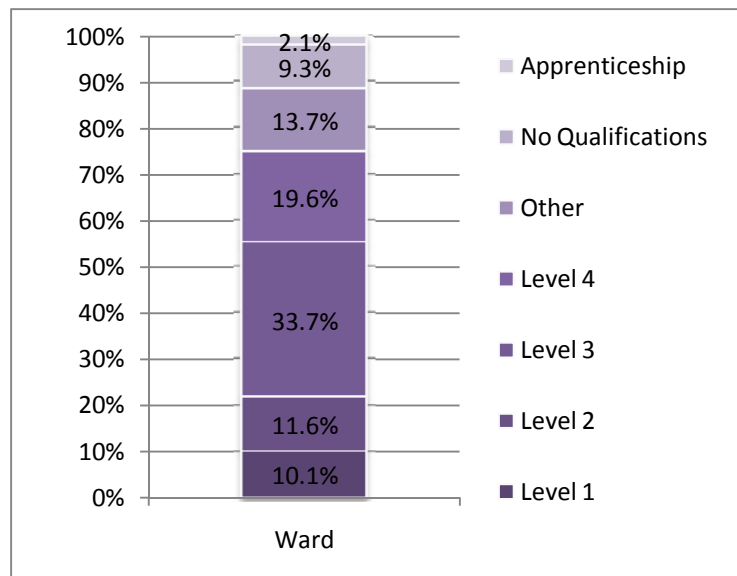

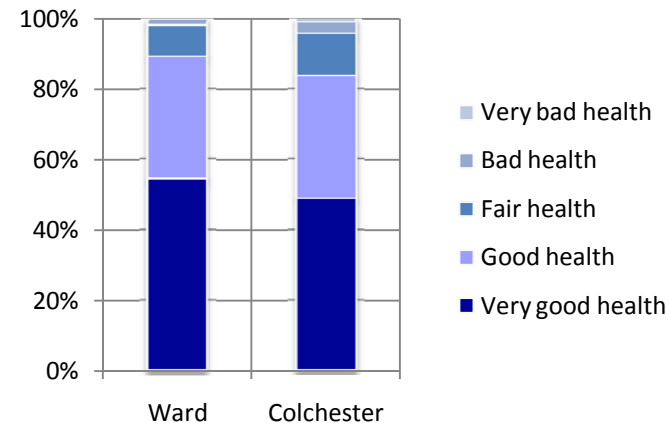

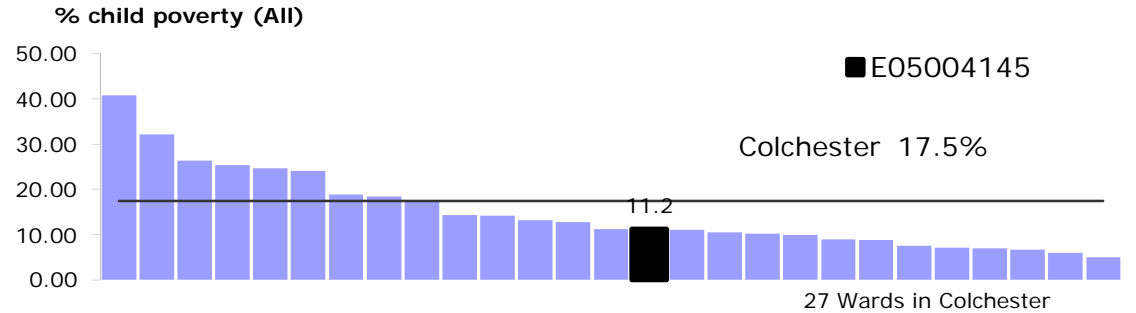


Child Poverty

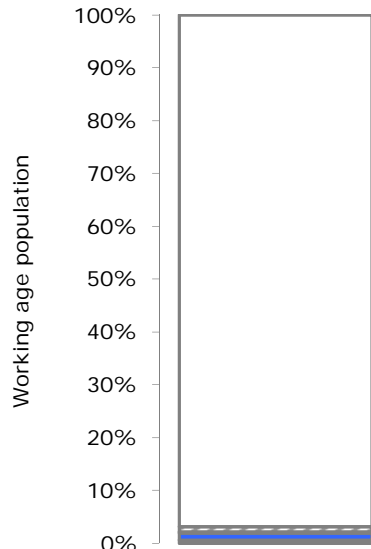
Fuel Poverty
